






## Nursery Activities Pick and Mix

<p><b><u>Get Reading</u></b></p> <p>Read some books together with adults and other children. Retell them by drawing a story map or pictures of the characters.</p> 	<p><b><u>Get Speaking</u></b></p> <p>Create rhyming pairs and rhyming strings with things in your house. e.g. cat, mat, sat, bat pen, ten, hen</p> <p>Go on a sound hunt – find things in your house that begin with the sounds m, a, s, t, d, p, n, i - e.g. socks.</p>	<p><b><u>Get Creative</u></b></p> <p>Create a junk model with some old recycling materials – what can you create?</p> <p>Sing songs and dance to your favourite songs.</p> 	<p><b><u>Get Mathematical</u></b></p> <p>Create a role play shop – give prices to things and count out pennies to match that amount.</p> <p>Go on a shape hunt around the house to find shape objects.</p> <p>Count how many things you can find that are red/yellow/blue/green.</p> 
<p><b><u>Get Exploring</u></b></p> <p>Try mixing things – mix paints and find out what colours they create?</p> <p>Mix water with herbs, leaves, petals, food colouring, water, flour? What happens?</p> <p>Make bubbles with washing up liquid – how can you make them big and small?</p>	<p><b><u>Get Online</u></b></p> <p>Cbeebies - Games online and app</p> <p>Phonics Bloom – Phase 1 and 2</p> <p>Top marks - Early years section</p> 	<p><b><u>Get Cooking</u></b></p> <p>Make and decorate biscuits</p> <p>Make a tea party for your family.</p> <p>Make breakfast or help with cutting vegetables.</p> 	<p><b><u>Character muscles</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Independence</u></b> - Keep trying to be independent in dressing, putting on clothes and toileting.</p> <p><b><u>Problem solving</u></b> – Sort out all of your toys in to tidy categories.</p> <p><b><u>Good Humour</u></b> – Continue to laugh and joke – find some child friendly jokes and silly rhymes to share together.</p>
