


Year 2 Homework Pick and Mix



<p><u>Get Reading</u></p> <p>Read another book by Julia Donaldson. Compare it to The Gruffalo. What are the similarities? What are the differences</p> 	<p><u>Get Speaking</u></p> <p>Act out and retell the story of the Gruffalo. Ask family members to take the parts of some of the characters.</p> 	<p><u>Get Creative</u></p> <p>Make some face masks or puppets for the characters from The Gruffalo. Use these to retell the story.</p> 	<p><u>Get Mathematical</u></p> <p>Create a repeating pattern using 3 different items. Discuss with children how they can make their patterns more complex using the same number of types of items, e.g. ABBAC, ABBAC.</p> 
<p><u>Get Exploring</u></p> <p>Investigate ways of making your heart beat faster without running.
