






Nursery Activities Pick and Mix



<p><u>Get Reading</u></p> <p>Read your favourite books and tell your adult why you like it? What part is your favourite? Who are the characters?</p> 	<p><u>Get Speaking</u></p> <p>Watch 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' story on YouTube – https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY</p> <p>What is happening? Why did he eat so much food? How did he change in to a butterfly? Where does he live?</p>	<p><u>Get Creative</u></p> <p>Make some salt dough or play dough and create something to keep to remember this time.</p> <p>Like a rainbow or handprints...</p> <p>https://www.bbcgoodfood.com/saltdough</p> 	<p><u>Get Mathematical</u></p> <p>Make number cards and hide them around the house / garden and then hunt for them like an Easter egg hunt.</p> <p>Can you do the same with different shapes too?</p> 
<p><u>Get Exploring</u></p> <p>Go on a hunt for insects - what can you find? Where were they living?</p> <p>Can you find out how to make them a 'bug hotel' – could you make one?</p>	<p><u>Get Online</u></p> <p>Play a minibeast topic themed game on: https://pestworldforkids.org/fun-games/games/</p> <p>My favourite is - Bug builder</p> 	<p><u>Get Cooking</u></p> <p>Could you make some bug related creations?</p> <p>Use 'Google' to find some ideas!</p> 	<p><u>Character muscles</u></p> <p><u>Confidence</u> – Talk to your adults about what you are good at? Can do now that you couldn't before?</p> <p><u>Concentration</u> – Try a task where you need to concentrate. E.g. a jigsaw, threading or a balancing game.</p>
