## Get Reading and Writing

Make some sound cards with a letter on each card. Can you make any words using your sound cards? Take it in turns with a grown up to make words. Who can spell the biggest word?



Can you write a simple story map? Draw pictures of who is in your story, where they might go and what happens when they are there. Add labels to your story map.

## Get Speaking

This week we are focusing on fairytale stories. Do you know any fairytale stories such as Little Red Riding Hood or Cinderella? Retell the story to your grown up. Find some objects around the house to enhance your story telling.



## Get Creative

Design your own dragon. Think about different materials you could use. Could you make different textures using a variety of equipment? Be creative in the tools that you use.



A potato masher could create an interesting stomach for your dragon. Sticks could be used to print eyes. What other ideas can you think of?

## Get Mathematical


Make some simple number cards and count the correct amount of objects out to match that number. Can you count out objects all the way up to 20?
