School Uniform

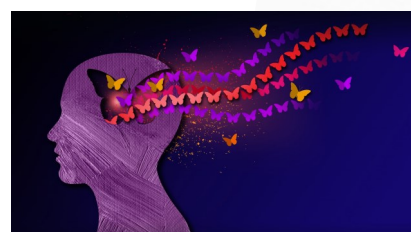
