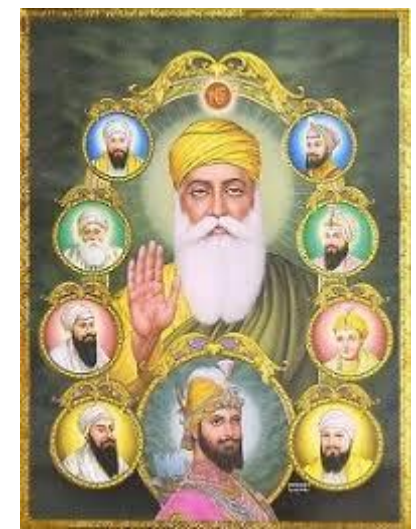

Guru Nanak	The first Guru is the founder of Sikhism.
5ks	5 items that signify the Khalsa.(Kara, Kesh, Kangi, Kirpan and Kacchaa)
Gurudwara	A holy place of worship.
Khalsa	the purified and reconstituted Sikh community instituted by Guru Gobind Singh on March 30, 1699
Guru Granth Sahib	The holy book.
Vaisakhi	The festival to celebrate the form of the Khalsa by Guru Gobind Singh.
Ek Onkar	One god that is eternal.
Guru	Guru is another word for teacher.

Baisakhi/Vaisakhi - To celebrate the birth of the Khalsa which was formed by Guru Gobind Singh.
